SAINTS OF FOREIGN MISSIONS

Since 1658, the Paris Foreign Missions have contributed to the evangelization of many Asian countries: Thailand, Vietnam, China, Cambodia, India, Laos, Japan, Korea, Malaysia, Singapore, Burma... In the 20th century, 23 missionaries gave their lives as martyrs and became saints. Today, the MEP (Paris Foreign Missions Society) has 150 priests in 14 countries and continues to participate in the proclamation of the Good News.

To visit: the Martyrs' Hall and the crypt; Saint Pierre Dumoulin-Borie rests there (1808-1838, canonized in 1988) along with the relics of other martyred saints.

ST. MADELEINE SOPHIE BARAT

1779-1865, canonized in 1925

Founder of the Society of the Sacred Heart. The nuns' mission is to educate young girls. Starting in 1818, communities expanded to Italy, South America, the United States, Australia... currently present in more than 40 countries.

ST. LOUISE DE MARILLAC

1591-1660, canonized in 1934

Co-founder with St. Vincent de Paul of the Company of the Daughters of Charity: "the Sisters of St. Vincent de Paul." She created small schools for poor girls and directed the sisters to care for all the excluded of her time. She is the patroness of social workers.

ST. VINCENT DE PAUL

Founder of the Congregation of the Mission, the Lazarist Fathers, and the Company of the Daughters of Charity. He worked against poverty, for the evangelization of rural areas, and for the training of priests. Canonized in 1737, he was proclaimed universal patron of charitable works by Pope Leo XIII in 1885.

ST. CATHERINE LABOURÉ

1806-1876, canonized in 1947
Sister of St. Vincent de Paul, she witnessed
three apparitions of the Virgin in 1830. During
one of these, she received the message:
"O Mary conceived without sin, pray for us
who have recourse to you" and was instructed
to have a medal struck.
